

1. Memorial Plaza (Corps Plaza) Replica Cannon

This option details a decorative cannon to be placed at the entrance to the Quad. The Corps' intent is to place the current 105mm cannon on one side of the arches in Memorial (Corps) Plaza, and purchase a non-functional, decorative Napoleon cannon for the other side. The functional 105 will still fire at midnight yell practice, and a plaque denoting the 2017 Class Gift will also be included.



2. CARPOOL Headquarters Relocation/Enhancement

CARPOOL's operations have been run out of the same location for almost ten years now. In that time, the organization has continued to reach milestones in its mission of providing safe rides to the Texas A&M and Bryan/College Station communities, including recently giving its 250,000th ride! As the organization continues to grow and operate, the need for a new enhanced facility is necessary to ensure CARPOOL's ability to continue its mission of providing safe rides home to our community for many years to come.



3. *Benjamin Knox Silver Taps Paintings Endowment*

Each month at Silver Taps, Benjamin Knox graciously gifts the families of those honored one of his paintings. A previous Class Gift originally funded Knox's contribution, but those funds have since run out. The Class of 2017 plans to set up an endowment with the Class Gift fund to perpetually fund Benjamin Knox's Silver Taps paintings, so the families of those remembered can receive this beautiful painting at no cost.



4. *Class of 2017 Aggie Ring Scholarship Endowment*



An endowed fund in the Class of 2017's name will be set up through the Association of Former Students to perpetually fund Aggie Ring scholarships. The requirements of the scholarship would be decided by the 2017 Class Agents, and could include rings for Aggie veterans or students of a certain identity-based background.

5. *Jack K. Williams Administration Building Lawn Renovation*

Providing the funds for the addition of new landscape and hardscape at the front lawn area of the Administration Building. Some improvements include the replacement of existing sidewalks, the addition of gardens and additional features, as well as new memorial benches and lighting. A plaque denoting the 2017 Class Gift will also be included.
