



By decree of the Residential Housing Association (RHA), pertaining to the Texas A&M University elections of all student placeholders, let these policies be held adamantly. All candidates who wish to campaign in the residence halls in any way take notice of these guidelines, as violations will result in penalties of various degrees.

- Campaigners may campaign in the residence halls on a specific date and time for each side of campus.
 - Northside will be on Tuesday, September 27, 2016. The Northside election staging area will be located in the main entrance of Hullabaloo Hall near the 24 hour desk at the Live Oak lounge.
 - Southside will be on Wednesday, September, 28, 2016. The Southside election staging area will be located in the Mod Quad.
 - Campaigners may campaign from 5:30pm-8:30pm. They must check in between 5:00pm and 5:30pm and check out by 9:00pm each night.
- Campaigners must provide a copy of the form submitted to the Election Commission at each election staging area. (Email receipt of registration).
- Campaigners must follow the stop signs on the residents' doors. If the stop sign is not present or not filled out, the campaigner is free to campaign in that room. If there are one or multiple stop signs on a door, follow the rules on the more restrictive sign.
- No flyers can be placed in the halls or on bulletin boards. This includes Door Sliding unless indicated on the stop sign.
- Campaigners must abide by all residence hall policies at all times. These policies may be found at <http://reslife.tamu.edu/rules> under the "Residence Hall Handbook" link. It is the responsibility of the campaigners to know these policies prior to the start of campaigning.
- Campaigners may be on each Floor or ramp for up to 15 minutes.

- Campaigners must be escorted through the residence halls at all times by an RA or other designated escort. If an escort isn't available, campaigners must wait for one.
- There may be 2 people per campaign per escort. Escorts may take up to 3 campaign groups. Max of 6 people per escort.
- Each campaigner must have a campaign card. Campaign cards will be distributed to each campaigner at the designated check in time and location. Campaigners are responsible for getting each of their escorts to sign their campaign card.
- If a candidate does not show up until later during the time frame, the time frame will still end as indicated and the candidate will have their campaign time cut.
- Violations deemed more grievous by the Residential Housing Association may result in removal from the ballot. All violations of these rules and Residence Hall Policies will be reported to the election commission.
